

During this year's Vacation Bible School an insightful young man asked me how long I had been the pastor of this church. I answered 15 years this August. He asked if I had been here longer than any other pastor to which I replied no, but that I was getting close.

Jan Lee Baptist Church and Burkburnett are the longest places of service for Kathy and I. We were in our mid 40's when we moved here. Both of our children were in college and unmarried. The church, community and country were in a very different place than it is now, there has been a lot of change.

After my first year of "getting my feet wet" so to speak, I challenged the church that while there were many positive things going on, unless we began to make some deliberate changes, particularly to reaching out to our community that Jan Lee Baptist Church would begin the process of dying. The church responded to that challenge and we saw about 100 growth in our worship attendance and regularly baptized several people every year.

My more laid-back leadership style worked well too for the people we had. Many mature and committed believes who were surrendered to the Lordship of Jesus, knowledgeable in the word of God, truly loved the church and sought

to share their faith with others did not require a lot of supervision, more just pointed in a direction and told to, "go."

The Lord has moved many of those saints either to be at home with Him or to another town and community to be closer to children and other family.

The question I ask myself now is, what is the future of Jan Lee Baptist Church?

I am certainly not the only one asking that question. Others at JLBC are asking it too. But it goes much deeper than that. You see, I find not only other Baptist asking that question, but also Methodist, Catholics and whatever Christian denominations are out there, wanting to know the same thing about their churches. And honestly the answer to that question is many will close their doors and cease to exist.

Will that be the fate of Jan Lee Baptist Church? And if it is, would anybody notice or care?

There are several ministry commitments I have made over the years. One was never to use manipulation or coercion to get people to do what they ought to be doing. I reaffirm that commitment to you.

Second, I commit to not have people doing meaningless "busy work" around the church and thus wearing or burning them out. This one is difficult to keep and requires constant vigilance from falling into that trap. But I reaffirm that commitment to you. Rather we want every member to fill the role God has

called and equipped them to in a meaningful way.

Lastly, I commit to not letting methodology (the way we do things) become sacred cow. I fought that battle as a young minster with an older minister who was tied to past methods. I will fight for those sacred boundaries, but I am willing to listen to new ideas on how we implement them.

I do not know how long God will keep me here as pastor at Jan Lee Baptist Church. I've have asked Him to make clear to me when it is my time to leave and let someone else take the reins.

Until then, I pray that as Pastor/Teacher, I have the energy and enthusiasm to "equip the saints (you) for the work of ministry, to build up the body of Christ (Jan Lee Baptist Church) until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of God's Son... becoming like Jesus (Ephesians 4:11-13).

My final question is, how do I accomplish that when I only see you one hour every two to three weeks? It can't be done.
