

I heard a story the other day I wanted to share with you in my own words.

Bill grew up in a good and happy home, with loving parents but it was not a Christian or even religious home. His parents would take him to a large mainline church a couple of times a year (Christmas and Easter) more for cultural reasons rather than religious.

As a teenager though, Bill began to feel empty inside and wondered if there was more to life than what he was experiencing. He began to attend the large church his parents had taken him to on his own, but it seemed to him more like a country club than a place where you would find answers to life's deep questions. His peers too, who attended, acted religious on Sunday, but he saw no difference in their lives Monday thought Saturday. That was not what he was looking for and quit attending. But he was still empty and searching.

There was a girl in Bill's school though named Sandy, whom he sat next to in one particular class. She always seemed happy and one day Bill asked Sandy, "why are you always so happy?" She answered, "Because I am saved!" To which he replied, "What does that mean!?" Sandy led Bill into a faith relationship with Jesus Christ, he was baptized and joined a local church, and began his faith journey. He also knew at that moment that he wanted to spend his life pursuing and teaching the gospel message to others. His salvation and calling were almost simultaneous.

Another aspect of Bill's life was that he was born with a genetic physical disability that would not allow him to play sports. But he was somewhat competitive and applied that competitive nature to his academics. During his high school years he and Sandy remained friends but he lost contact with her after graduation. Bill would go on to earn multiple degrees in philosophy and theology and would become a well-respected Christian scholar, apologist, and author.

Years later, Bill was invited to speak at a university near his hometown in a publicized event. After his presentation people were coming down to the stage area to greet him and a woman approached, shook his hand but said nothing. Confused, he asked, "Do I know you?" she replied, "I'm Sandy." He related that a flood of memories came rushing back and was extremely happy to see her. His own salvation and life's calling, and purpose had begun by asking one question to this one happy Christian.

Bill, in this true story, is Dr. William Lane Craig but the real hero is Sandy. His testimony illustrates the difference one happy Christian can make in the world. When I heard Dr. Craig relate this story in a podcast the other day my thought was not wondering if I was like him but rather did my life reflect that of Sandy's?

Most people will never be famous, not even for 15 minutes, but we can matter to some individual that may go on to influence millions. More likely they will go on to influence just one or two more and that matters.

Dallas Willard defined joy as constant and pervasive sense of wellbeing. Jesus called that being blessed. The world often calls that being happy. And the world is looking for happy people who are happy even when there seems no reason to be so, people who love and are grateful, who give and receive grace and mercy, who have a solid foundation and daily purpose for life, people who know they are saved even though they do not deserve it because of what God has done for them Jesus Christ.

An old hymn has these verses...

Why should I be discouraged? Why should shadows come. Why should my heart be lonely, and long for heaven and home, When Jesus is my pardon? My constant friend is He: His eye is on the sparrow and I know He watches me.

"Let not your heart be troubled," His tender word I hear,

And resting on His goodness, I lose my doubts and fears. Though by the path He leadeth, but one step I may see, His eye is on the sparrow, and I know He watches me.

I sing because I'm happy.
I sing because I'm free.
For His eye is on the sparrow
And I know He watches me. *
