The term "war-weary" means to be tired of or depressed by war. I have heard that even during World War 2, a war most of the population supported, the population grew tired and depressed of the daily grind and tragedy of war. I think too, we are COVID-weary in the same way.

How do we then develop a prudent and systematic plan and approach in the midst of a pandemic to meet the physical, emotional, social, and spiritual needs of the congregation who have different individual priorities of care?

Another thing weighing on my mind:

For several years I grew into following Christian apologist and evangelist. Ravi Zachariah on an increasing level. I would listen to him on an almost daily basis, gaining a greater understanding of the gospel and how to defend and present it to a skeptical community. I waded through his books and other writings in an attempt to grasp the faith at a deeper level. I was impressed at his humble approach to ministry and his effort to recruit young apologists to carry on the ministry after he was gone. I often quoted him and recommended him to others. I donated financially to the ministry and was saddened by his death to cancer.

But then, after his death, everything began to unravel. Ravi had suffered from sever back problems for years and would often seek relief from masseuses. After his death, many began to come forward to say Ravi had abused them sexually. There had been a claim from a woman several years before of the same thing, but Ravi had vigorously defended himself from those accusations. All this turned out to be true. Ravi had done these things and it could be proven. As one Christian minister has put it, Ravi's family and ministry are decimated. His ministry is being dismantled, books removed from the "shelves," and his audio and video deleted from the internet.

We have not heard more about this because Ravi was not the typical "Christian character" that the late-night talk show hosts love to roast, then skewer when they fall. He was well respected and thoughtful in so many ways, which makes all this even more confusing.

So, does this prove, as some claim, Christianity to be false? If it cannot change someone like Ravi, can it change me?

I have other thoughts and questions I do not have all the answers to, but I am running out of room. Where do we go from here, where is our hope?

Jesus said, "Do not let your heart be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me... I have told you these things so that in me you may have peace. You will have suffering in this world. Be courageous! I have conquered the world" (John 14:1, 16:33).

These are the opening and closing verses to Jesus's great discourse to His disciples just before his arrest and crucifixion. There is much more He had to say in between, but let these simple words give you courage to live as Christ in a troubled world.

My plan is to keep moving forward in the simplicity of the gospel. I am going to love God, love the truth of His word, love the church and love those far from God... it is all I can do right now.
