



Several days ago, I was having repair work done in our home. It was a fairly uncomplicated and quick repair, so the technician and I were engaged in a conversation about life in general. The person knew what I do as a profession, and in the course of conversation, some particulars of pastoral life came forth and in the ensuing discussion the technician said, "I never thought about pastors doing that." One interesting part of being a pastor is you often get to be involved in people's lives from birth to death.

May and June are months that we in the church and in our community have traditionally thought about marriage, family and parenting. Mother's Day, school graduations, Father's Day and June being the "wedding month" may spark that.

In the old days of the church, back when I was a kid, I remember Mother's Day as a big event. My dad would bring home roses on Saturday to wear on our lapels on Sunday. You wore red if your mother was living and white if your mother was deceased. During Sunday service, the oldest mother, the youngest mother, and other distinctions would be honored.

Life was simpler then, and Mother's Day, I've learned, can be a hurtful day for women who were or are unable to have children, or for those whose mother was less than honorable.

As far as Father's Day, as a child, I have no recollection of it being celebrated other than finding my dad some cheap gift of some sort. Oh well, but maybe okay.

In the Biblical record, somewhere between Jesus's twelfth birthday and the beginning of His public ministry, Joseph disappears from that record. The assumption, because the Bible does not directly tell us, is that he died. And the fact that Matthew 1:19, 24-25 tells us he was an honorable man, so the assumption is plausible. It doesn't mean Joseph's relationship with Jesus, Mary, and the rest of their children was not significant. It does mean they dealt with the loss of him.

The record of Jesus and His relationship with His mother goes on through the gospel account through the beginning of the book of Acts (1:14). What do we know about her?

- 1. Mary had a relationship with God and had His unearned favor (Luke 1:27).
- 2. Mary's life of grace honored God (Luke 1:30).
- 3. Mary sought support from her family in dealing with the reality of her calling (Luke 1:39ff).

- 4. Mary's life was permanently altered by her decision to submit to God's calling (Matthew 1-2; Luke 1-2).
- 5. Mary faced hardship and personal risk in her calling (Matthew 2; Like 2)
- 6. Mary struggled to understand her relationship with Jesus as He grew into adulthood (Luke 2:41-52; John 2:4; 12:46-50).
- 7. Mary may have suffered hurt by the teachings of Jesus (Luke 14:26).
- Mary suffered alongside Jesus in His darkest moment (John 19:25).
- Mary was honored by Jesus in His darkest moment (John 19:26-27).
- 10. Mary knew Jesus not only came as her son, but as Savior, as well and was a member of the church (Acts 1:1:14).

We honor the fact, while we are not all mothers or fathers, that we all certainly had a mother and a father. And if we received nothing else from them, we at least attained life that God declares sacred.

All these passages contain references to life, death, graduation, weddings, fatherhood and motherhood. Let us honor God in all.
