



The New Year is often a time for people to evaluate their life and assess where they are at and ultimately where they want to be. It often takes the form of a New Year's resolution or two. Most of the time those resolutions fade by February, and we go back to the way it used to be.

I was recently talking with someone who had a serious heath diagnosis. He was telling me he had a conversation with his health care providers and was asked by them if he had changed his life; that often when people get a serious diagnosis like his, they often evaluate what they are doing and begin to do what they really want to do. He said his response was he hadn't changed because he is already doing what he wants to do with his life.

As I have studied through Paul's letter to the Church at Philippi, I believe this is where Paul is, not based on a new year beginning, but rather because his life was in peril of ending. He, too, was already doing what he wanted to do. He just did not have the freedom to do it where and when he wanted.

Paul knew ultimately one of two things was going to happen, either he would be released and allowed to freely continue his ministry, or he would be executed and go to be with Jesus. He puts it this way:

"I will continue to rejoice, for I know that through your prayers and the help given me by the Spirit of Jesus Christ, what has happened to me will turn out for my deliverance. I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or death. For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain" (Philippians 1:19-21).

Our friend Wes Bartlett used to put it this way when faced with a potential life or death situation: "It's all good, a win – win. Either I get to stay here serving God and enjoying my family or I get to go home and be with the Lord."

I think this is a biblical way of belief that should drive our behavior. Take January 2nd's Sunday School lesson that Rick presented online dealing with Luke 2:25-32, and the man Simeon for example. Simeon could truly be considered a man who was "Spiritual and not religious!" He was described as one who was in a right relationship with God (righteous), and he faithfully put into practice what he believed (devout). And he was filled with the Holy Spirit (the Spirit was on upon him) who was both speaking to him and leading him to go and do what He wanted Simeon to do.

Ultimately, Simeon's life was grounded in the hope of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He saw the significance of life extending far beyond his limited time on this earth and adjusted his life accordingly. He was prepared to "meet his maker" in true peace. God was who He said He was and had done what He said He would do.

We must live for two "days." One is today and the other is "That day, which is the day we meet the Lord in person, whether it is "in the air" when Christ returns or at the death of this body. How we view "That" day will drive how you live today.

Did you know there are over two billion people on this planet right now who in some shape, form, or fashion claim the name of Jesus Christ? What would happen to this world if each one of us lived as Simeon did? How would it change the world?
