There's the old "preacher" joke about the church calling a new pastor. The first Sunday, the new pastor got up and preached his first sermon. The congregation was pleased, not too long, not to short, but just right. The next Sunday rolled around, and the pastor got up to preach and he preached the exact same sermon as the week before. The congregation thought. "Hum... well that is interesting, and I wonder what all that's about?" The third Sunday comes, and the new pastor does the exact same thing. Now the "Now wait a congregation says, minute, what's the idea here, why have you preached the same exact sermon three weeks in a row?" The new pastor answers, "Well, as soon as we start doing what this one says, we'll move to the next sermon."

I may have told that joke one hundred times, but it does seem to me that I preach the same things over and over again. In fact, someone commented on my recent sermon series that I had preached those same passages just a couple of years ago. So why the repetition?

For me, the same biblical and doctrinal concepts and ideas continue revolving in my mind. I have yet to "master" the concept and I need to rework those in a new sermon series. Repeating them again in reading, study and presentation helps me move closer to biblical "mastery." And if I need it, you do too.

Also, we have people in the church that have aged into adulthood, or are new to our community and congregation, or are new to the faith and need to be instructed. They need to be taught as if they were hearing the gospel for the first time. When a pastor stays in one place for 18 years, that is going to happen.

Where we need to be cautious though is not becoming spiritually complacent in our Christian development. The writer of Hebrews says,

> "Although by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the basic principles of God's revelation again... (deeper teaching) is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish between good and evil. Therefore, let us leave the elementary teachings about and Christ **g**0 on to maturity..." (Hebrews 5:12, 14, 6:1a CSB).

The elementary teachings about Christ concern the basics of what it means to be declared right with God. Children can understand, believe, and trust the gospel message: That Jesus is God and became a man; He lived a sinless life doing good; He died on the cross for our sins and was buried: God raised Him from the dead on the third day; He appeared to many and ascended to heaven; the Holy Spirit is His presence with the church now and. He is now interceding for the saints from heaven; and He will return from heaven one day for His people. That is the basics. That is what any person, young or old needs to know, believe, and trust to be saved.

When a person professes faith in Jesus, they are led to follow him in believer's baptism. This visual and symbolic representation of the death. burial, and resurrection of Jesus, and the new believer's visual statement about their own "death, burial and resurrection" to a new life in Christ is essential in being obedient to Jesus. Baptism though, must be seen as a beginning of something and not an end. It is the first step of a Christian's obedience and not the last. We are commanded to baptize and then teach these new Christians everything Jesus has commanded us (Matt 28:20).

Many Christians are satisfied with the "shallow waters" of their initial experience with Christ. May it never be so at Jan Lee Baptist Church. We must never let our contentment in Christ become compliancy toward Christ.

Let us move forward from these essential and important teachings about Christ to the "deep end" of our faith of walking continually with Christ.

Let us delve into the nature of God and our relationship with Him.

Let us explore our physical and spiritual origins and who we are in Christ and what it means to be created in his image (Gen 1:27).

Let us come to terms with the ultimate and eternal meaning of life, and how we are to live out that meaning in the world today.

Let us understand and come to grips with the consummation of our lives, our world, and the universe in the hands of our God.
