

What in the world is God doing? Coming out of the COVID disruption, we had grown back to a steady, inperson attendance of approximately 60 people in worship on a Sunday morning. Then on July 31 we saw an almost one hundred precent increase to 117 and have leveled off at average attendance of 87 with 66 average attendance in Sunday school.

The Apostle Paul wrote to the church at Corinth:

"What then is Apollos? What is Paul? They are servants through who you believed, and each has the role the Lord has given. I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So then neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth" (I Corinthians 3:5-7).

Someone might ask, "What are we doing to cause this?" My answer, "We are not doing anything that we have not always done. We just praise God for providing the growth."

It has always been my desire that the church faithfully and consistently "plant and water" - that we do so in a spirit of love and for His glory. And, that we do so to the best of our abilities and talents that He has gifted us with.

So, what are God's expectations?

First, God has called us to regularly worship Him with other believers, which is to give glory to God through praise and thanksgiving. This acknowledges who God is and aligns us with that reality.

God desires that we grow spiritually through both individual and group Bible study and prayer. These, along with the other disciplines build community and nurture us in the faith.

God also wants us to serve Jesus through the mission work of our church. My mantra is "Pray – Know – Give – Go" to make disciples of all nations through our church. That mission begins with our family and neighbors.

God expects His church to work hard. To do so effectively and efficiently each member must give their money, their time, and their talents to this end. This allows us to be good managers of God's resources, it lightens the load for each member, and builds community as we work together.

God desires that we be one with Him and one another. We recognize God's design for the church is unity within a diverse congregation. So we must serve and put the interests of others ahead of our own. We must seek and give forgiveness; we must protect the integrity of the church by our own Christ like attitude and behavior.

God wants us to pray for and follow the leadership of the church. Leadership is given to guide the church to worship, to care for one another, to teach God' Word, to equip the church for the work of ministry, and to protect the teachings and doctrine of the church against false teachers. Finally, God wants us to share the good news of Jesus with others. As we identify those who are far from God, we intercede for them, we invest in them, and invite them to "come and see" who Jesus is and who we are. Ultimately, we want to introduce them to Jesus so they may have the same "reason for hope that is in us."

These seven expectations are how we "plant and water" just as Paul and Apollos did in Corinth. But we know who causes the growth. It is God!

I am grateful for every faithful, longserving member of Jan Lee Baptist Church who has been here through thick and thin.

I am grateful for the Christians whom God has recently led our way. I look forward to serving the Lord with you in the time God allows us.

I am grateful for new believers in Christ whom we have recently baptized. I am excited to work with you as you grow in fellowship with God and His church.

I am grateful for you who are here but still seeking God's will for your life in your place of service. I have no doubt, that if you are a believer, you are to serve the Lord in a local church. I will pray that God lead you to your place. I am unashamed to say I hope and pray it is with us.

I am grateful for those who will come our way in the future... God knows who they are.
