

Several years ago, Kathy and I took a vacation to our nation's capital in Washington DC. It was a great trip in many ways but there is a caveat to time and space. We chose to go in June, and we chose to stay in, as it was said to us, a "trendy area." Our choice of time and space in DC were simply based on availability and price but we wound up getting way more than we bargained for staying at "ground zero for Pride Month. We had a great trip, but we received an "education" also.

Dr. Jim Denison in his June 3, 2024 "The Daily Article" outlines briefly the origins of Pride Month... how we got here. To quote him:

"In 1989, neuropsychologist Marshall Kirk and advertising executive Hunter Madsen joined their psychological and marketing expertise to chart a game plan to make same-sex marriage the law (and sentiment) of the land:

- Focus on the normalization of homosexuality.
- Identify churches that can be manipulated to promote homosexuality and the idea that gays are victims.
- Convince Americans that the issue is anti-discrimination, not gay rights.
- Reclaim or invent a noble history of gay people.
- Caricature opponents of gay marriage as hateful.

Their book became a seminal reading for gay activists. And their game plan worked. According to Gallup, 68% of Americans opposed same-sex marriage in 1996; today, 71 percent support it.

Now activists have an entire "Pride Month" in which to pursue their four-fold strategy: <u>normalize</u> LGBTQ behavior, <u>legalize</u> it, <u>stigmatize</u> those who oppose their agenda, and <u>criminalize</u> such opposition."

Years ago, President Obama used (maybe he coined it) a phrase, "the wrong side of history." If we oppose homosexual behavior and same-sex marriage as normal, in the short term at least, we are on the wrong side of history. What are we to do?

Let me make some proposals:

- 1. We must affirm and uphold the ideal of biblical marriage, family, and human sexuality. This takes us beyond the issue of same-sex relationships to all intimate relationships. never Jesus addresses same-sex relationships directly but challenges disciples to uphold an overall sexual ethic that would include, by default, same-sex relationships (Matthew 5:27-32, 19:1-12; Mark 7:20-21).
- 2. We must practice what we preach. Jesus says we are wise not only if we hear his words but act on them (Matthew 7:24-27). When we act in a way that is different sexually than what we say we believe we lose our credibility and witness.
- 3. We must acknowledge we struggle with sexual temptation; Christians are not immune. As a matter of fact, it is said of Jesus, "We do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has been tempted in every way as we are, yet without sin" (Hebrews 4:15).

- 4. We must then go to the source of our strength, which is Christ Himself, to overcome. "Let us approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace in our time of need" (Hebrews 4:16).
- 5. We then, as we have removed the proverbial "log" from our own eye, can effectively help someone by removing a "splinter" from their eye (Matthew 7:1-5).
- 6. We must understand also that it is very unlikely that we will ever "debate or argue" someone out of a life of sexual immorality. Only Jesus through the Holy Spirit can do that (Matthew 7:6).
- 7. We must treat all people, friend, or foe, agree, or disagree, whether they come to Jesus or not, with love, dignity, and respect (Matthew 5:38-48; 7:12).

Several years ago, I heard a Christian political commentator speak. He said he had an opponent that he would argue with over moral issues. He said never once did he convince him of his side. Then one day he had the opportunity to share the gospel with his opponent and he came to Jesus. Never again did they argue over morality.
