I've said to you before that the kingdom of God is bigger than Jan Lee Baptist Church. If Jan Lee Baptist Church ceased to exist, the kingdom of God would go on. But Jan Lee Baptist Church is certainly a part of the kingdom of God, and she matters to God.

How do I know JLBC matters to God? Because I matter to God, and you matter to God, and you and I together make up JLBC. Thus, the Body and Bride of Christ that gathers at 1004 Jan Lee Drive matters to God.

We also matter because we are a church who are, literally, on a mission from God. In 1980 Dan Aykroyd and John Belushi made a film, "The Blues Brothers." The story is a comedic tale of redemption for a paroled convict and his brother, who set out on "a mission from God" to prevent the foreclosure of the catholic orphanage in which they were raised. What they meant for comedy, God meant for us, for real.

Before Jesus ascended to heaven he gave his disciples a mission. Matthew records,

"Jesus came and said to them, all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:18-20).

Luke, in Acts recorded the words of Jesus,

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8). And Jesus certainly extended the mission to us, the following Christian generations. John records Jesus's words in His high priestly prayer prior to His

> "I do not ask for these only, but also <u>for those who will believe in</u> <u>me through their word</u>, that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me" (John 17:20-21).

We live in a country and world that is in turmoil. We certainly do not know what tomorrow holds, but Jesus said, "Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you" (Matthew 6:33).

When I was a tank platoon leader it was drilled into us that the soldier, the tank crew, and platoon to my right and left was counting on me to do my job so that we might both survive and win the battle. In the same way, the church in America and around the world is counting on me and you to do our job, not only that we might survive but that we too may, when the spiritual battle that rages around us, liberating those who are lost and far from God into the eternal hope we have and enjoy in Christ Jesus.
