

Over the last several years I have issued a New Years challenge to the church. A particular discipline to help us grow in our faith and knowledge of the Lord.

I began, I believe, with the challenge of memorizing the Sermon on the Mount. That was followed by reading through the whole Bible in a year. And then last year, I challenged us to read through four classic Christian books. That one did not go as I planned, but that certainly was not your fault, but mine. I did not follow up with you like I intended.

I do not see these as "one and done" challenges but rather ongoing challenges that we add to our disciplines. Memorizing portions of Scripture, the continuous reading of the whole counsel of God, and reading good Christian books ought to be a way of life for us as we grow and mature in our faith and walk with the Lord.

This year I would like us to immerse ourselves in the wisdom literature of God. The challenge is to read through the Book of Proverbs, one chapter a day for an entire month for all twelve months. By December 31, 2025, we each will have read God's wisdom twelve times (minus Proverbs 31 which we will have read seven times). I have never done this but have listened to others who have, and they testify that they greatly benefited from it.

Let me share with you some of the introduction to the book of Proverbs from the Disciple's Study Bible:

"Ancient thinkers apparently recognized auite early orderliness of the world in which they lived. They understood that if they tried to live in harmony with that set order, life would be much more enjoyable and fulfilling. We call these thinkers, 'wise men' and their writing 'wisdom writings...' In Israel 'wisdom' thinking probably began among the clans or early tribes. Such early Israelite wisdom consisted of simple observations about life. One generation handed these down to another in a continuing search for the answers to life's perplexing problems. Such observations probably dealt with topics such as integrity, contentment, and sexual and family relationships. Unlike their neighbors' wisdom, for Israel 'the fear of the Lord' provided the central theme...' The Book of Proverbs clearly defines how God people expects His find meaningful existence... that centers uniquely on God Himself.

Proverbs clearly remind us that we are all walking down the road of life, a road with two branches. The one chosen by the wise produces joy, happiness, and a meaningful existence as well as eternal hope. The other chosen by the foolish brings about heartache, sorrow, and ultimate destruction. Since there is clearly no middle ground, Dame Wisdom (that is the personification of wisdom in the Proverbs) pleads with us:

- 1) To acknowledge God as the Creator and Sustainer of the world.
- 2) To repent of our sin and to trust in God as Lord and Savior.
- 3) To so order our lives in accordance with His will that His love will clearly be reflected in our relationships with our families, friends, neighbors, strangers, and even our enemies.
- 4) To teach these precepts diligently to our children both in word and in deed; and
- 5) To praise God for the fullness and joy that He provides along the way" (DSB, Proverbs, p. 749-750).

So, my challenge to you (and myself) is let's <u>stop thinking we are smarter than God</u> together. Pick a different translation of the Bible each month to read Proverbs through. And remember, paraphrasing Jesus at the end of the Sermon on the Mount, "Wise is the one who hears the words of God and puts them into practice, this is the person who builds their life on a solid foundation that will stand the test of time and trouble" (Matthew 7:24-25).

We have established a team called The Upper Room Team. To be part of the Upper Room Team, we are asking 120 individuals or families to donate \$100 per month.
